


John A. Feagin Jr., MD, Leadership Endowment and Forum

The John A. Feagin Jr., MD, Leadership Endowment has been established to create unique opportunities in moral and ethical leadership development for students, residents, and fellows. The Feagin Leadership program partners with other leadership efforts at Duke in the areas of medicine, research, athletics, military, and business. The Feagin Endowment is the only such interdisciplinary organization in existence. This collaborative effort creates a platform for the identification of leadership issues, which can be shared within and across each discipline to enhance the development of cross-functional leaders throughout the world.

The Feagin Forum is an invitation-only event which seeks participation from an exclusive group of proven leaders from the medical, research, sports, military, and business communities who wish to continue to share their expertise and to engage in lifelong development of their own leadership skills. World-renowned orthopaedic surgeons, worldclass athletic coaches, highly decorated military officers, and successful global business leaders lead the Feagin Forum faculty.

Duke University is the perfect environment for the Feagin Leadership Endowment and Forum because of a tradition that fosters moral and ethical reflection, responsible leadership, and spirited debate. Duke's decades of proven success in medicine, research, and athletics combined with strong relationships with military and business leaders provide a distinctly conducive environment for the vision of John Feagin's leadership to be fulfilled through the Feagin programs.





Colonel John A. Feagin Jr., MD (U.S. Army, Ret.)

John Feagin graduated from The U.S. Military Academy–West Point in 1955. He enrolled in Duke University School of Medicine while on leave as an artillery lieutenant with the 82nd Airborne Division of the U.S. Army—becoming the first active duty Army officer to attend medical school. Upon graduation from Duke, he returned to the Army and spent the next 18 years as a military surgeon.

It was during Dr. Feagin's assignment as team doctor for orthopaedics at West Point in the 1960s that he was introduced to sports medicine. He was a pioneer of hip replacement, studying with Sir John Charnley in the 1970s. He established a joint replacement fellowship at Letterman Army Medical Center in San Francisco and performed most of the Army's joint replacements for the next few years.

After retiring from the Army in 1979, Dr. Feagin ran a rural private practice in Jackson Hole, Wyoming, until his return to Duke a decade later. For the next 10 years at Duke, he would advance the field of joint replacement and sports medicine as team physician and chief of orthopaedics at the Durham VA Medical Center. It was during this time that Dr. Feagin imagined a sports medicine fellowship. He retired in 1999 and was named associate professor emeritus of surgery.

Dr. Feagin's volunteer work has been extensive. He volunteered with the U.S. Ski Team and Olympic teams and was chosen as team doctor for the 1992 U.S. Ski Team. He has done mission work all over the world, including many trips to Cuba, where he teaches arthroscopic surgery.
